The annual school grade is based on a point system. A composite score of 1,050 points equals an "A". This year, we scored 1101 points (51 points more than that required to be an "A" school). Because of a penalty grade for not meeting one of the requirements under the performance standards for reading, we are a "B" school. We were out performed by only one school in our district by a total of 6 points. That school has outscored us by a total of only 10 points in a combined two years of testing. We have made remarkable progress. While I am pleased with our effort, we are still engaged in pursuit of the goal (to become an "A" school).


